

Companion Cumberland retired from the US Army as a Lieutenant Colonel, and is a retired Pastor of the United Methodist Church.

Companion Cumberland married the former Lynda Carolyn King on December 18th, 1993. They have 5 children; Derek, Amy, Perry, John, and Mack.

Companion Cumberland was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Pearl River Lodge No. 105 in Carthage, MS, on April 27th, 1998, is currently the Treasurer of Sherrard Byrd No. 353, and holds membership at Capitol No. 600 and the Mississippi Lodge of Research No. 640. He has served as Worshipful Master of both Capitol No. 600 and Sherrard Byrd No. 353.

He was Exalted in Jackson Chapter No. 6, Greeted in Jackson Council No. 5, and Knighted in Mississippi Commandery No. 1. He currently has membership at Wilmon Stewart Chapter No. 146, Luther Walker Council No. 57, and Hattiesburg Commandery No. 17, of Poplarville. He has served as presiding officer of all three bodies.

He received the Consistory Degrees in the Valley of Jackson in 1998, with membership currently at the Valley of Hattiesburg. MOTION

With Jiles K. Grice, Grand Scribe, presiding, a motion presented by Jared F. Stanley, Grand Secretary, that the Grand High Priest's Address be referred as follows: Necrology to the Necrology Committee, Law to the Capitular Law Committee, Finance to the Finance Committee and the remainder of the address to a Special Committee of three composed of R. Lane Dossett, Chairman, Bill W. Sloan, and Thomas L. Cumberland, was seconded and passed.

COMBINED LONG RANGE PLANNING

The following report, submitted by Companion Jason A. Jefcoat, was adopted.

Excellent Grand High Priest, Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Commander:

This committee was conceived of by Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Kenneth Eccles Dyer four years ago and he served as our Chairman until his death on January 28, 2021. The death of Brother Ken and his wife Mrs. Gloria, was and still is a tremendous blow to the future of our fraternities. Four years ago, when Brother Ken introduced the idea of this committee to us, he told us that York Rite Masonry would be dead in five years if we did not make some hard and drastic changes.

Some of the ideas proposed by this committee include:

- The dividing of our State into six Districts with a Regional Representative appointed in each
- Development of Checklists for visiting Reps to use.
- Recommending other York Rite Bodies assist in purchasing jewels, shoulder boards, etc.
- The Holy Land Pilgrimage Medal
- Requiring each Body to have a balanced budget and raising fees and per capita dues.
- Promote the York Rite Leadership Program
- Developing a summary of the Degrees and Orders to be read to each class of candidates
- Encourage accountability of the local York Rite Bodies

Unfortunately, most of our proposals have been completely ignored by our patriarchs and elected leadership. Any ideas of change seem to paralyze us with a fear of losing more members. The State was divided into Districts.

Unfortunately, most have not had a representative appointed, and those that have a representative are not receiving official visits. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Medal has not been promoted, and most of our Brethren do not even know the purpose of the program. The majority of our elected officials have not and will not attend the Leadership Program. New Companions and Sir Knights are being made with very little understanding of what a York Rite Mason is supposed to be. There is zero accountability of the local bodies to the Grand Bodies.

Brethren, there is a gap between our brethren over 45 and those under 45. We have many members who are older and few in the middle. We are now seeing the younger generation seek out Masonry and it is imperative that we learn and develop ways to engage them to ensure the Fraternity's future and success. Most men will spend their money on something of quality that provides stimulation, fun and camaraderie if they are receiving something of value. It is time to review and reconsider what we provide the new member. For the past 25 years, we have been losing members. We do not have 25 more! Let us get started in making this a premier organization again!!!

FINANCE

The following report, submitted by Companion R. Lane Dossett, Chairman, was adopted.

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest; Grand Chapter Officers, Companions and Distinguished Guests:

Your Finance Committee and the Fraternity as a whole suffered a great loss this year in the death of our Chairman, Kenneth E. Dyer. To say that losing him has affected continuity would be a gross understatement. We will strive to live up to his ideals of fiscal responsibility, giving our best for the Rite.

The York Rite Bodies previously eliminated the "Audit" line item from the budget. The Committee subsequently learned, however, that this line item included not only an audit but also bookkeeping services provided by the same vendor. While the vendor indicated he would provide these services as a holdover courtesy, no reports have been received as of the time of this writing, rendering a categorized statement of income and expenditures and budgeting difficult this year. Actual data, as could be discerned from the bank statements and other sources, has been provided in the proposed budget. With there being only approximately 5 sources of income and about a dozen itemized groups of expenses, the Committee believes that external bookkeeping services are not necessary relative to the small amount of our income and expenses. Moving forward, the Committee requests deposits and expenditures be recorded in a categorized spreadsheet format for annual budgeting and reporting purposes.

The Committee's review of the most recent bank records revealed we ended slightly in the black for a positive year! Revenue was \$26,308.17 and expenses

were \$25,729.46, for a net gain of \$578.71. While positive, we largely missed last year's budget projection of a net gain of \$7,496. We project next year to also be a positive year, with the per capita increase going into effect, raising income.

The Committee recommends the Grand York Rite Bodies charge a collective \$50 per person registration fee for attendance at Grand Annual Sessions to be divided among the bodies, said fee amount applying regardless of which part or parts the registrant attends.

The Committee thanks the Anointed Order of High Priesthood for its support of the Grand Chapter through the purchase of the Grand High Priest's apron case. To further reduce expenses, the Committee solicits sponsorship from a York Rite affiliated entity of the Grand High Priest's apron and jewel.

The Committee recommends continuation of the normal budgeted expenditures, including but not limited to a jewel and apron of the highest quality for the outgoing Grand High Priest and embossed name badges for all Grand Officers.

GRAND SECRETARY

TO THE GRAND CHAPTER OF ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF MISSISSIPPI:

I herewith submit to you my annual report as your Grand Secretary. The Grand Chapter currently has 28 Subordinate Chapters. We exalted 5 new Chapter Masons last year which is 32 less than the previous year. We Suspended 167 Companions for non-payment of dues which is 76 more than last year. Death claimed 90 of our Companions which is 29 more than last year. We Reinstated 13 which is 6 less than last year.

It is worth noting that with the increase in Per Capita and Degree Fee charges to the Grand Chapter, many Chapters have stopped "holding" members over, or remitting their dues and paying their Per Capita on their behalf. In doing so, many were Suspended for Non-Payment of Dues, or discovered to have been deceased.

The University of Connecticut, the Hearing Health Institute and Autism Speaks are our "research arm for better hearing health." As the focus of our charitable works, RAM's have contributed over \$9,000,000 for the worthy causes, yet they are still underfunded.

The need for cochlear ear implants among our children is an ever pressing concern that demands our attention. Between 2% and 7% of children are

diagnosed with a need for this device and boys are more likely to be afflicted. At present, there is no cure for CAPD and treatment is specific to each person.

As the spoken word is so essential to Our Craft, so is it necessary to humanity at large. For those suffering from CAPD, small sound differences in words may cause the message to be lost. Example Message - "Look at the cows over there" becomes "Look at the clowns on the chair." Imagine teaching under those circumstances.

As these programs are certainly worthy of our continued support, I urge each of you to petition your local chapters to contribute at lease \$1.00 per member as requested in years past to help our children and grand children who will be in need of this important research.

The Combined Grand York Rite Necrology Committee submits the following report:

We are most grateful to the Grand Master of Heaven and Earth that the Grand Lines of each of the Grand York Rite Bodies has not been broken in the year that has passed. However, we are all too well aware of the ravages of time and inevitable fact of mortality that governs our existence while traveling through this veil of tears. In the Masonic year that has passed since our last assembly we have recorded the following losses to the York Rite Bodies: We lost ninety (90) members of the Grand Chapter of RAM; eighty three (83) members of the Grand Council of RSM, and eighty one (81) members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of MS. (note that the numbers are different because not all were members of all Bodies)

While we are not able at this time to recount the honors and faithful service of each of these Masonic Brothers, the committee does note that one Past Grand Master and Past Presiding Officer of all three York, as well as past presiding officer of all appendant York Rite Bodies was translated to the Celestial Lodge Above by the Great Architect of Man's destiny.

Past Grand Master Kenneth Eccles Dyer passed away at his home in Columbus MS along with his Wife of more than 60 years, Gloria Joyce Dyer. Their death was a tragic loss for the Masonic Community in Mississippi. They were both active in all aspects of the Masonic Community.

Kenneth Eccles Dyer was born on April 6, 1942 in Whitewater MO, the son of Elwin and Addie Capella Dyer. He was graduated from South Eastern Louisiana State University with a degree in Mathematics. He served in the United States Marine Corps and retired in the rank of Colonel. He was employed by Weyerhaeuser for 26 years and on retirement continued in a teaching position with East Mississippi Community College. He was a Baseball fan and was

selected to Umpire in the 1980 Little League World Series. He also umpired in the SEC Baseball games.

PGM Ken Dyer served as Grand Master of Masons in Mississippi for the Masonic Year of 2013 -2014. In addition, he was Past Presiding Grand Officer of All Grand York Rite Bodies. He served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest of MS RAM in 2011. In addition, he was the District Deputy General Grand High Priest for the South East for the Triennium just ending. He served as Grand Illustrious Master of MS RSM in 2002. He was the General Grand District Deputy Grand Illustrious Master of Cryptic Masons International in the Bicentennial Year. In that position He was Host for the South Eastern York Rite Conference in Jackson, MS. He served as Grand Commander of Knights Templar in MS for the year of 2005. He was Aide de Camp to a Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar USA. MW Dyer was instrumental in establishing the Holy Land Pilgrimage Award for Mississippi Pastors to visit the Holy Land. In the Appendant Orders in MS, MW Dyer was the Past Governor/Secretary of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America No. 83. He also served as Grand Governor and was the holder of the Purple Cross. In the Red Cross of Constantine MW Dyer was Past Puissant Sovereign and Past Intendent General for Mississippi. He was also Past General Grand Standard Bearer for the United Grand Imperial Council. PGM Dyer was also a Scottish Rite Mason and a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor. He was a member of the Eastern Star and Royal Order of Scotland, and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine.

Alfred Edward Lightsey, Sr. was born in Heidelberg MS on December 18, 1933. He attended High School at Heidelberg. After graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and honorably served a four year term. Upon discharge Ed enrolled in Jones Junior College and then in Mississippi State University earning a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1962. That same year he accepted a position at Cape Kennedy with the National Aeronautical and Space Administration. Companion Sir Knight Lightsey participated in every manned space flight mission from the first earth orbit in 1962 to the launch of the Space Shuttle program. Ed retired from the Johnson Space Center in Houston TX as Deputy Branch Chief and Program Manager.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was raised a Master Mason in W.E. King Lodge No. 615 located in Heidelberg MS. He was active in and participated in all Lodge activities as long as his health permitted. Ed was dedicated to the Blue Lodge and server W.E. King as its Worshipful Master. While WM he actively participated in the "Thursday Morning Bunch" that met first at Hub City Lodge and Later at Hattiesburg Lodge at Eatonville. He strived for excellency and proficiency in the Blue Lodge Ritual.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was a member of Laurel York Rite Bodies. He served as Presiding Officer in the Chapter, Council, and Commandery at Laurel. In 2006 He was elected to serve as Grand Captain General of the Grand Commandery of Mississippi. As Grand Commander he emphasized the Holy Land Pilgrimage and was instrumental in securing funding to send a Local Pastor from W.E. King Lodge to the Holy Land. In 2011 he was elected as Grand Captain of the Host in the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. He served through the line becoming Grand King in 2014 and did not seek advancement because of health problems.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was an active participant in all the activities of Hamasa Shrine Temple in Meridian Mississippi, along with his Wife Geraldine. He was Past President of the Laurel Shrine Club and very active in raising funds for Hamasa and the Children's Hospital Program. He was elected Potentate of Hamasa Shrine in 1990. He was a member of the Scottish Rite serving in both the Hattiesburg and Meridian Valleys. He was Coroneted a 33rd Degree Inspector General Honorary in the First Class to be held in Mississippi at Corinth.

One of Companion Sir Knight Lightsey's sayings was that "he had done more than he ever hoped to do, and he wished that every young person should have that same opportunity".

The Combined Necrology Committee moves the adoption of this report, and requests that if approved the York Rite Bodies here assembled observe a time of silence in memory of our Departed Brethren and that the Grand Prelate Of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Mississippi offer a Memorial Prayer in their behalf.

It is our sincere desire that you feel that you are an important part of the activities taking place at this Assembly, because you are.

NECROLOGY

We give thanks to the Supreme Grand Master, Ruler of heaven and Earth for the safe keeping of our Grand Council in Mississippi in the 2020-2021 Council year. We are deeply grateful that the Grand line has not been broken in any of our York Rite Bodies Lines in the year that has pass since our last meeting. There were no out of State visitations because of COVID. I do plan to attend the South East York Rite Conference in Mobile AL later this year.

GRAND LECTURER

We especially commend our Grand Lecturer/Instructor Inspector Companion Homer E. Sullivan. Our Mini Festivals were well organized and executed, with excellent attendance. The work was performed in a commendable manner, and prior preparation made the work flow in an efficient manner.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The past year has been very difficult because of COVID restrictions. I recommend that we explore different opportunities for face to face meetings in the coming year.

CRYPTIC MASON OF THE YEAR

The Cryptic Mason of the Year has been selected and will be recognized at the appropriate time.

BROWNLEE-SHEARER ZABUD APRON

One outstanding Cryptic Mason will be presented the apron to wear at the appropriate time.

ADULT LEADERSHIP AWARD

In consultation with the Executive Officer of DeMolay for MS one Companion has been selected to be awarded the Service award, and it will be awarded at the appropriate time.

CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH

The Cryptic Masons Medical Research fund was well represented by Companion PIGM Leslie Reeves. The research that is accomplished by these funds are extremely important for all of us, and we commend Companion Reeves in his efforts.

CONCLUSION

It has been a great Honor to serve this Grand Council as Illustrious Grand Master in the year that has passed, and I extend my deeply felt appreciation to the Grand Council Officers, Past Grand Illustrious Masters, and Companions who have supported me this year. to a Special Committee of three composed of M. Keith Ballard, PIGM, Chairman; Leslie E. Reeves, PIGM, and Jerry W. Reeves, PIGM, was seconded and passed.

FINANCE

The following report, submitted by R. Lane Dossett, Chairman, was seconded and adopted.

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master; Grand Council Officers, Companions and Distinguished Guests:

Your Finance Committee and the Fraternity as a whole suffered a great loss this year in the death of our Chairman, Kenneth E. Dyer. To say that losing him has affected continuity would be a gross understatement. We will strive to live up to his ideals of fiscal responsibility, giving our best for the Rite.

The York Rite Bodies previously eliminated the "Audit" line item from the budget. The Committee subsequently learned, however, that this line item included not only an audit but also bookkeeping services provided by the same vendor. While the vendor indicated he would provide these services as a holdover courtesy, no reports have been received as of the time of this writing, rendering a categorized statement of income and expenditures and budgeting difficult this year. Actual data, as could be discerned from the bank statements and other sources, has been provided in the proposed budget. With there being only approximately 5 sources of income and about a dozen itemized groups of expenses, the Committee believes that external bookkeeping services are not necessary relative to the small amount of our income and expenses. Moving forward, the Committee requests deposits and expenditures be recorded in a categorized spreadsheet format for annual budgeting and reporting purposes.

The Committee's review of the most recent bank records revealed we ended slightly in the red for a loss. Revenue was \$17,938.94 and expenses were \$18,615, for a net loss of \$648.84. We largely missed last year's budget projection of a net gain of \$3,989. We project next year to be a positive year, with the per capita increase going into effect, raising income.

The Committee recommends the Grand York Rite Bodies charge a collective \$50 per person registration fee for attendance at Grand Annual Sessions to be divided among the bodies, said fee amount applying regardless of which part or parts the registrant attends.

The Committee thanks the Thrice Illustrious Masters for their support of the Grand Council through the purchase of the Most Illustrious Grand Master's apron case. To further reduce expenses, the Committee solicits sponsorship from a York Rite affiliated entity of the Most Illustrious Grand Master's apron and jewel.

The Committee recommends continuation of the normal budgeted expenditures, including but not limited to a jewel and apron of the highest quality for the outgoing Most Illustrious Grand Master and embossed name badges for all Grand Officers.

I herewith submit to you my annual report as your Grand Recorder. The Grand Council currently has 26 Subordinate Councils. We greeted 5 new Council Masons last year which 31 less than the previous year. We Suspended 161 Companions for non-payment of dues which is 76 more than last year. Death claimed 83 of our Companions which is 7 more than last year. We Reinstated 12 which is 7 less than last year.

It is worth noting that with the increase in Per Capita and Degree Fee charges to the Grand Council, many Councils have stopped "holding" members over, or remitting their dues and paying their Per Capita on their behalf. In doing so, many were Suspended for Non-Payment of Dues, or discovered to have been deceased.

As you know, Annual Returns are due into this office by February 1st of each year. With less than a 1-month notice, it was impractical, if not impossible, to put out a job notice, interview, make a selection, and train new employees in the time given. Thankfully, my family saw my struggles and I was blessed to have them offer their assistance.

During the month of December 2020, B. Myles Stanley worked as an unpaid intern with Carolyn to learn as much of her duties as time would permit. While it is impossible to 'replace' a long-time asset like Carolyn, Myles has proven to be a competent and dedicated worker. Given time, I feel confident the Craft as a whole will also come to see Myles as an asset to this office.

During December 2020, and the start of January 2021, Jennifer R. Stanley worked as an unpaid intern with Dana to learn as much of her duties as time would permit. This was extremely critical as Dana was the one who "worked" the Annual Returns — comparing data between years, ensuring all data is captured properly, and more. Now that we are past our Annual Return cycle, I trust all can agree that while Mrs. Dana most assuredly did an excellent job, that Jennifer is also equal to the task of fulfilling the duties of this position.

Please allow me to further inform you as to Jennifer's qualifications. Jennifer has an Associate's Degree in Business Technology – a degree that taught her not only traditional office procedures and equipment, but also up-to-date technologies and processes. She furthered this education with a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting. Her knowledge in these areas is an extreme benefit to this office and the Craft.

It is also worth noting that Jennifer is working Part Time – only paid per hour of work, which is a change to the largely "salary" status of that position in the past. This means she will never quality for Retirement Benefits. Jennifer is also a Disabled Veteran, receiving medical benefits from the Department of Veteran's Affairs. While the York Rite does not pay wages or benefits for either of these positions directly, the savings realized while Jennifer is employed may be an opportunity for the Grand York Rite Bodies to further re-evaluate the Management Fee paid to the Grand Lodge, which helps offset these types of costs.

Special thanks go to Companions Michael Baker, John McKelvy, and Charles Stephens for their support during these Virtual Annual Sessions. I would also like to express my Thanks to Companion Bobby Ainsworth for completing the printing of our 2020 Proceedings.

Finally, thank you for allowing me to serve as your Grand Recorder, and Many Thanks to all those who have provided helpful advice and working hands to make these 2021 Sessions possible.

PGHP, PIGM, PGC who was Chairman of the committees and provided exceptional advice and leadership in getting us where we are today. He will be missed, but we hope to continue following his guidance and principles as we continue the important work of these committees.

As of December 31, 2020, The Perpetual Program completed the year with fourteen (14) participating Chapters, fourteen (14) participating Councils and twelve (12) participating Commanderies.

The investment strategy is working well even through the COVID 19 pandemic. The total amount of funds as of December 31, 2020 are \$10,813.51 CD in Regions Bank, \$29,247 in Checking in Regions Bank and \$66,165.59 investments at Edward Jones Financial for a total of \$106,226.10.

COMBINED NECROLOGY

The Combined Grand York Rite Necrology Committee submits the following report:

We are most grateful to the Grand Master of Heaven and Earth that the Grand Lines of each of the Grand York Rite Bodies has not been broken in the year that has passed. However, we are all too well aware of the ravages of time and inevitable fact of mortality that governs our existence while traveling through this veil of tears. In the Masonic year that has passed since our last assembly we have recorded the following losses to the York Rite Bodies: We lost ninety (90) members of the Grand Chapter of RAM; eighty three (83) members of the Grand Council of RSM, and eighty one (81) members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of MS. (note that the numbers are different because not all were members of all Bodies)

While we are not able at this time to recount the honors and faithful service of each of these Masonic Brothers, the committee does note that one Past Grand Master and Past Presiding Officer of all three York, as well as past presiding officer of all appendant York Rite Bodies was translated to the Celestial Lodge Above by the Great Architect of Man's destiny.

Past Grand Master Kenneth Eccles Dyer passed away at his home in Columbus MS along with his Wife of more than 60 years, Gloria Joyce Dyer. Their death

was a tragic loss for the Masonic Community in Mississippi. They were both active in all aspects of the Masonic Community.

Kenneth Eccles Dyer was born on April 6, 1942 in Whitewater MO, the son of Elwin and Addie Capella Dyer. He was graduated from South Eastern Louisiana State University with a degree in Mathematics. He served in the United States Marine Corps and retired in the rank of Colonel. He was employed by Weyerhaeuser for 26 years and on retirement continued in a teaching position with East Mississippi Community College. He was a Baseball fan and was selected to Umpire in the 1980 Little League World Series. He also umpired in the SEC Baseball games.

PGM Ken Dyer served as Grand Master of Masons in Mississippi for the Masonic Year of 2013 -2014. In addition, he was Past Presiding Grand Officer of All Grand York Rite Bodies. He served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest of MS RAM in 2011. In addition, he was the District Deputy General Grand High Priest for the South East for the Triennium just ending. He served as Grand Illustrious Master of MS RSM in 2002. He was the General Grand District Deputy Grand Illustrious Master of Cryptic Masons International in the Bicentennial Year. In that position He was Host for the South Eastern York Rite Conference in Jackson, MS. He served as Grand Commander of Knights Templar in MS for the year of 2005. He was Aide de Camp to a Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar USA. MW Dyer was instrumental in establishing the Holy Land Pilgrimage Award for Mississippi Pastors to visit the Holy Land. In the Appendant Orders in MS, MW Dyer was the Past Governor/Secretary of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America No. 83. He also served as Grand Governor and was the holder of the Purple Cross. In the Red Cross of Constantine MW Dyer was Past Puissant Sovereign and Past Intendent General for Mississippi. He was also Past General Grand Standard Bearer for the United Grand Imperial Council. PGM Dyer was also a Scottish Rite Mason and a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor. He was a member of the Eastern Star and Royal Order of Scotland, and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine.

Alfred Edward Lightsey, Sr. was born in Heidelberg MS on December 18, 1933. He attended High School at Heidelberg. After graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and honorably served a four year term. Upon discharge Ed enrolled in Jones Junior College and then in Mississippi State University earning a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1962. That same year he accepted a position at Cape Kennedy with the National Aeronautical and Space Administration. Companion Sir Knight Lightsey participated in every manned space flight mission from the first earth orbit in 1962 to the launch of the Space Shuttle program. Ed retired from the Johnson Space Center in Houston TX as Deputy Branch Chief and Program Manager.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was raised a Master Mason in W.E. King Lodge No. 615 located in Heidelberg MS. He was active in and participated in all Lodge activities as long as his health permitted. Ed was dedicated to the Blue Lodge and server W.E. King as its Worshipful Master. While WM he actively participated in the "Thursday Morning Bunch" that met first at Hub City Lodge and Later at Hattiesburg Lodge at Eatonville. He strived for excellency and proficiency in the Blue Lodge Ritual.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was a member of Laurel York Rite Bodies. He

served as Presiding Officer in the Chapter, Council, and Commandery at Laurel. In 2006 He was elected to serve as Grand Captain General of the Grand Commandery of Mississippi. As Grand Commander he emphasized the Holy Land Pilgrimage and was instrumental in securing funding to send a Local Pastor from W.E. King Lodge to the Holy Land. In 2011 he was elected as Grand Captain of the Host in the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. He served through the line becoming Grand King in 2014 and did not seek advancement because of health problems.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was an active participant in all the activities of Hamasa Shrine Temple in Meridian Mississippi, along with his Wife Geraldine. He was Past President of the Laurel Shrine Club and very active in raising funds for Hamasa and the Children's Hospital Program. He was elected Potentate of Hamasa Shrine in 1990. He was a member of the Scottish Rite serving in both the Hattiesburg and Meridian Valleys. He was Coroneted a 33rd Degree Inspector General Honorary in the First Class to be held in Mississippi at Corinth.

One of Companion Sir Knight Lightsey's sayings was that "he had done more than he ever hoped to do, and he wished that every young person should have that same opportunity".

The Combined Necrology Committee moves the adoption of this report, and requests that if approved the York Rite Bodies here assembled observe a time of silence in memory of our Departed Brethren and that the Grand Prelate Of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Mississippi offer a Memorial Prayer in their behalf.

Charles Lynn "Fuzzy" Cox was born in Durant, Mississippi on September 10, 1941 to Elizabeth and Charles Cox. He received his education in the Durant School District, Holmes Jr. College, and Delta State University. He also served in the US Army from 1963-1966.

Sir Knight Cox married Carolyn in Pearl, MS, on December 12, 1987. Their children are Anthony, Leigh, Daniel, and Robert.

He was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Tyrian Lodge No. 427 in Jackson, Mississippi, on April 22, 1980. This is still his home Lodge, where he has served in several stations including Treasurer from 1995-2008, and as Worshipful Master in 1987 and 2016. He was also a charter member of the Mississippi Lodge of Research No. 640, where he served as Worshipful Master in 2019, and is an honorary member of Museum Watt Carter Lodge No. 636, where he serves as Chaplain.

Sir Knight Cox has served the Grand Lodge of Mississippi in many capacities, including Grand Sword Bearer (1987), Deputy Grand Master (1989), Junior Grand Warden (2009), Senior Grand Warden (2010), Grand Master (2011) and Grand Orator (2017). Most Worshipful Cox served as a Member of the Board of Custodians from 2017-2021.

Sir Knight Cox was Exalted, Greeted & Knighted on May 24 & 25 of 1984 in Jackson, MS. He has served as Master of the Second Veil (1989), High Priest (2015) and Treasurer (2019-Present) in Jackson Chapter No. 6, as Illustrious Master (2015) and Treasurer (2019-Present) in Jackson Council No. 5, and as Commander (2015) and Treasurer (2019-Present) in Mississippi Commandery No. 1. He has also been admitted into the Order of High Priesthood and Thrice Illustrious Masters.

Sir Knight Cox is also a member of several other masonic bodies typically associated with the York Rite, including: Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis (Celebrant, 2011), Knight Masons (Treasurer since 2015), Red Cross of Constantine (Saint Leonard Chapter), York Rite Sovereign College of Mississippi, and participates in his local York Rite Degree Team. He has also received the Super Excellent Master Degree.

Sir Knight Cox is also a member of the Jackson Scottish Rite Valley, having been initiated in Spring of 1982. He served as since been honored with the Knight Commander of the Court of Honour on December 13, 1989 in Hattiesburg, MS, and Crowned as an Inspector General Honorary in 2009, in Corinth, MS. Sir Knight Cox is also a member of the Royal Order of Scotland and a past member of his local Scottish Rite Degree Team.

Sir Knight Cox is also a member and Past Patron (1991) of Brandon Chapter No. 269, Order of the Easter Star. He is also the State Membership Chairman for Mississippi DeMolay, serves as DeMolay Dad at Capital Chapter, and is a member of the DeMolay Legion of Honor.

MOTION

With Sir Knight Charles L. Cox, Deputy Grand Commander, presiding, a motion presented by Jared F. Stanley, Grand Recorder, that the Grand Commander's Address be referred as follows: Necrology to the Necrology Committee, Law to the Templar Jurisprudence Committee, Finance to the Finance Committee and the remainder of the address to a Special Committee of three composed of Jimmy L. Windham, PGC, Chairman; Jiles K. Grice, PGC; and Kiely D. Walker, PGC, was seconded and passed.

FINANCE

The following report, submitted by R. Lane Dossett, Chairman, was seconded and adopted.

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander; Grand Commandery Officers, Sir Knights and Distinguished Guests:

Your Finance Committee and the Fraternity as a whole suffered a great loss this year in the death of our Chairman, Kenneth E. Dyer. To say that losing him has affected continuity would be a gross understatement. We will strive to live up to his ideals of fiscal responsibility, giving our best for the Rite.

The York Rite Bodies previously eliminated the "Audit" line item from the budget. The Committee has learned, however, that this line item included not only an audit but also bookkeeping services provided by the same vendor. While the vendor indicated he would provide these services as a holdover courtesy, no reports have been received as of the time of this writing, rendering a categorized statement of income and expenditures and budgeting difficult this year. Actual data, as could be discerned from the bank statements and other sources, has been provided in the proposed budget. With there being only approximately 5 sources of income and about a dozen itemized groups of expenses, the Committee believes that external bookkeeping services are not necessary relative to the small amount of our income and expenses. Moving forward, the Committee requests deposits and expenditures be recorded in a categorized spreadsheet format for annual budgeting and reporting purposes.

The Committee's review of the most recent bank records revealed we ended in the red for a large loss. Revenue was \$28,723.68 and expenses were \$35,775.32, **for a net loss of \$7,051.64**. This reduced the Commandery checking account by 20%. Cash in hand as of March 31, 2020 was \$36,059.69, compared to March 31, 2021, of \$29,008.05. While a loss was projected, the actual loss was much greater than last year's budgeted amount of (\$2,759).

Even with the \$5 per capita increase going into effect next year, the committee projects continuing loses through at least 2024 based on the currently scheduled biennial per capita increases. For projection purposes, assuming the same amount of deaths and suspensions for non-payment of dues, even with the per capita increase, revenue will be \$1,000.00 less, assuming all other factors were constant. The Committee believes that one of the principal reasons for the difference in Commandery finances from the Chapter and Council is that the Commandery has approximately 400 members it exempts from local bodies, while Grand Encampment does not allow for exemptions and is charging per capita on those members, which is much higher relative to the other two Bodies.

Revenue was also less than expected due to many local bodies "cleaning up the books" in anticipation of the per capita increase by reporting unexpectedly high deaths and suspensions.

The Committee recommends that the current schedule for biennial per capita increases be amended to address the continuing deficits. The Committee recommends a \$7.50 per capita increase be added in the next off year, to take affect during the 2022-2023 year, with the \$5 biennial increases continuing thereafter consistent and in the same years as the Grand Chapter and Grand Council.

The Committee recommends the Grand York Rite Bodies charge a collective \$50 per person registration fee for attendance at Grand Annual Sessions to be divided among the bodies, said fee amount applying regardless of which part or parts the registrant attends. While this will not erase the deficit, it is a small source of income.

The Committee thanks the Mississippi York Rite Sovereign College for its support of the Grand Commandery through the purchase of the Grand Commander's jewel and shoulder bars. The Committee thanks the Knights Preceptor for its support of the Grand Commandery through the purchase of the Grand Commander's belt.

The Committee recommends continuation of the normal budgeted expenditures, including but not limited to embossed name badges for all Grand Officers.

GRAND RECORDER

TO THE GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF MISSISSIPPI:

I herewith submit to you my annual report as your Grand Recorder. The Grand Commandery currently has 19 Subordinate Commanderies. We knighted 5 new Commandery Masons last year which is 34 less than the previous year. We Suspended 162 Sir Knights for non-payment of dues which is 64 more than last year. Death claimed 81 of our Sir Knights which is 20 more than last year. We Reinstated 12 which is 15 less than last year.

It is worth noting that with the increase in Per Capita and Degree Fee charges to the Grand Commandery, many Commanderies have stopped "holding" members over, or remitting their dues and paying their Per Capita on their behalf. In doing so, many were Suspended for Non-Payment of Dues, or discovered to have been deceased.

It is also worth noting that exemptions continue to be submitted to this office, and are approved, per our bylaws – yet these exemptions continue to negatively impact the financial wellbeing of our Grand Commandery, as the Grand Encampment does not recognize exemptions. In other words, we are paying Per Capita to the Grand Encampment on Sir Knights who have stopped financially contributing to this body.

Everyone enjoyed working with Dana and her work was top-notch. We wish her and her husband, Paul, all the best in their future endeavors for their family.

As you know, Annual Returns are due into this office by February 1st of each year. With less than a 1-month notice, it was impractical, if not impossible, to put out a job notice, interview, make a selection, and train new employees in the time given. Thankfully, my family saw my struggles and I was blessed to have them offer their assistance.

During the month of December 2020, B. Myles Stanley worked as an unpaid

intern with Carolyn to learn as much of her duties as time would permit. While it is impossible to 'replace' a long-time asset like Carolyn, Myles has proven to be a competent and dedicated worker. Given time, I feel confident the Craft as a whole will also come to see Myles as an asset to this office.

During December 2020, and the start of January 2021, Jennifer R. Stanley worked as an unpaid intern with Dana to learn as much of her duties as time would permit. This was extremely critical as Dana was the one who "worked" the Annual Returns — comparing data between years, ensuring all data is captured properly, and more. Now that we are past our Annual Return cycle, I trust all can agree that while Mrs. Dana most assuredly did an excellent job, that Jennifer is also equal to the task of fulfilling the duties of this position.

Please allow me to further inform you as to Jennifer's qualifications. Jennifer has an Associate's Degree in Business Technology – a degree that taught her not only traditional office procedures and equipment, but also up-to-date technologies and processes. She furthered this education with a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting. Her knowledge in these areas is an extreme benefit to this office and the Craft.

It is also worth noting that Jennifer is working Part Time – only paid per hour of work, which is a change to the largely "salary" status of that position in the past. This means she will never quality for Retirement Benefits. Jennifer is also a Disabled Veteran, receiving medical benefits from the Department of Veteran's Affairs. While the York Rite does not pay wages or benefits for either of these positions directly, the savings realized while Jennifer is employed may be an opportunity for the Grand York Rite Bodies to further re-evaluate the Management Fee paid to the Grand Lodge, which helps offset these types of costs.

Special thanks go to Companions Michael Baker, John McKelvy, and Charles Stephens for their support during these Virtual Annual Sessions. I would also like to express my Thanks to Companion Bobby Ainsworth for completing the printing of our 2020 Proceedings.

Finally, thank you for allowing me to serve as your Recorder, and Many Thanks to all those who have provided helpful advice and working hands to make these 2021 Sessions possible.

Excellent Grand High Priest, Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Commander:

This committee was conceived of by Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Kenneth Eccles Dyer four years ago and he served as our Chairman until his death on January 28, 2021. The death of Brother Ken and his wife Mrs. Gloria, was and still is a tremendous blow to the future of our fraternities. Four years ago, when Brother Ken introduced the idea of this committee to us, he told us that York Rite Masonry would be dead in five years if we did not make some hard and drastic changes.

Some of the ideas proposed by this committee include:

- The dividing of our State into six Districts with a Regional Representative appointed in each
- Development of Checklists for visiting Reps to use.
- Recommending other York Rite Bodies assist in purchasing jewels, shoulder boards, etc.
- The Holy Land Pilgrimage Medal
- Requiring each Body to have a balanced budget and raising fees and per capita dues.
- Promote the York Rite Leadership Program
- Developing a summary of the Degrees and Orders to be read to each class of candidates
- Encourage accountability of the local York Rite Bodies

Unfortunately, most of our proposals have been completely ignored by our patriarchs and elected leadership. Any ideas of change seem to paralyze us with a fear of losing more members. The State was divided into Districts. Unfortunately, most have not had a representative appointed, and those that have a representative are not receiving official visits. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Medal has not been promoted, and most of our Brethren do not even know the purpose of the program. The majority of our elected officials have not and will not attend the Leadership Program. New Companions and Sir Knights are being made with very little understanding of what a York Rite Mason is supposed to be. There is zero accountability of the local bodies to the Grand Bodies.

Brethren, there is a gap between our brethren over 45 and those under 45. We have many members who are older and few in the middle. We are now seeing the younger generation seek out Masonry and it is imperative that we learn and develop ways to engage them to ensure the Fraternity's future and success. Most men will spend their money on something of quality that provides stimulation, fun and camaraderie if they are receiving something of value. It is time to review and reconsider what we provide the new member. For the past 25 years, we have been losing members. We do not have 25 more! Let us get started in making this a premier organization again!!!

COMBINED NECROLOGY

The Combined Grand York Rite Necrology Committee submits the following report:

We are most grateful to the Grand Master of Heaven and Earth that the Grand Lines of each of the Grand York Rite Bodies has not been broken in the year that has passed. However, we are all too well aware of the ravages of time and inevitable fact of mortality that governs our existence while traveling through this veil of tears. In the Masonic year that has passed since our last assembly we have recorded the following losses to the York Rite Bodies: We lost ninety (90) members of the Grand Chapter of RAM; eighty three (83) members of the Grand Council of RSM, and eighty one (81) members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of MS. (note that the numbers are different because not all were members of all Bodies)

While we are not able at this time to recount the honors and faithful service of each of these Masonic Brothers, the committee does note that one Past Grand Master and Past Presiding Officer of all three York, as well as past presiding officer of all appendant York Rite Bodies was translated to the Celestial Lodge Above by the Great Architect of Man's destiny.

Past Grand Master Kenneth Eccles Dyer passed away at his home in Columbus MS along with his Wife of more than 60 years, Gloria Joyce Dyer. Their death was a tragic loss for the Masonic Community in Mississippi. They were both active in all aspects of the Masonic Community.

Kenneth Eccles Dyer was born on April 6, 1942 in Whitewater MO, the son of Elwin and Addie Capella Dyer. He was graduated from South Eastern Louisiana State University with a degree in Mathematics. He served in the United States Marine Corps and retired in the rank of Colonel. He was employed by Weyerhaeuser for 26 years and on retirement continued in a teaching position with East Mississippi Community College. He was a Baseball fan and was selected to Umpire in the 1980 Little League World Series. He also umpired in the SEC Baseball games.

PGM Ken Dyer served as Grand Master of Masons in Mississippi for the Masonic Year of 2013 -2014. In addition, he was Past Presiding Grand Officer of All Grand York Rite Bodies. He served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest of MS RAM in 2011. In addition, he was the District Deputy General Grand High Priest for the South East for the Triennium just ending. He served as Grand Illustrious Master of MS RSM in 2002. He was the General Grand District Deputy Grand Illustrious Master of Cryptic Masons International in the Bicentennial Year. In that position He was Host for the South Eastern York Rite Conference in Jackson, MS. He served as Grand Commander of Knights Templar in MS for the year of 2005. He was Aide de Camp to a Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar USA. MW Dyer was instrumental in establishing the Holy Land Pilgrimage Award for Mississippi Pastors to visit the Holy Land. In the Appendant Orders in MS, MW Dyer was the Past Governor/Secretary of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America No. 83. He also served as Grand Governor and was the holder of the Purple Cross. In the Red Cross of Constantine MW Dyer was Past Puissant Sovereign and Past Intendent General for Mississippi. He was also Past General Grand Standard Bearer for the United Grand Imperial Council. PGM Dyer was also a Scottish Rite Mason and a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor. He was a member of the Eastern Star and Royal Order of Scotland, and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine.

Alfred Edward Lightsey, Sr. was born in Heidelberg MS on December 18, 1933. He attended High School at Heidelberg. After graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and honorably served a four year term. Upon discharge Ed enrolled in Jones Junior College and then in Mississippi State University earning a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1962. That same year he accepted a position at Cape Kennedy with the National Aeronautical and Space Administration. Companion Sir Knight Lightsey participated in every manned space flight mission from the first earth orbit in 1962 to the launch of the Space Shuttle program. Ed retired from the Johnson Space Center in Houston TX as Deputy Branch Chief and Program Manager.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was raised a Master Mason in W.E. King Lodge No. 615 located in Heidelberg MS. He was active in and participated in all Lodge activities as long as his health permitted. Ed was dedicated to the Blue Lodge and server W.E. King as its Worshipful Master. While WM he actively participated in the "Thursday Morning Bunch" that met first at Hub City Lodge and Later at Hattiesburg Lodge at Eatonville. He strived for excellency and proficiency in the Blue Lodge Ritual.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was a member of Laurel York Rite Bodies. He served as Presiding Officer in the Chapter, Council, and Commandery at Laurel. In 2006 He was elected to serve as Grand Captain General of the Grand Commandery of Mississippi. As Grand Commander he emphasized the Holy Land Pilgrimage and was instrumental in securing funding to send a Local Pastor from W.E. King Lodge to the Holy Land. In 2011 he was elected as Grand Captain of the Host in the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. He served through the line becoming Grand King in 2014 and did not seek advancement because of health problems.

Companion Sir Knight Lightsey was an active participant in all the activities of Hamasa Shrine Temple in Meridian Mississippi, along with his Wife Geraldine. He was Past President of the Laurel Shrine Club and very active in raising funds

for Hamasa and the Children's Hospital Program. He was elected Potentate of Hamasa Shrine in 1990. He was a member of the Scottish Rite serving in both the Hattiesburg and Meridian Valleys. He was Coroneted a 33rd Degree Inspector General Honorary in the First Class to be held in Mississippi at Corinth.

One of Companion Sir Knight Lightsey's sayings was that "he had done more than he ever hoped to do, and he wished that every young person should have that same opportunity".

The Combined Necrology Committee moves the adoption of this report, and requests that if approved the York Rite Bodies here assembled observe a time of silence in memory of our Departed Brethren and that the Grand Prelate Of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Mississippi offer a Memorial Prayer in their behalf.

DIVINE SERVICE

Due to the nature of this Conclave being held virtually, Divine Service was provided in print to all Sir Knights and is reproduced here.

SERMON by Jason A. Jefcoat - Grand Prelate

Great Conversions

We first meet Saul as a devout Jew, and one of the violent defenders of the Pharisees and their belief in the absolute obedience to the Laws of Moses.

In Acts Chapter 7 vs 58: "And they cast him out of the city, and stoned him: and the witnesses laid down their clothes at a young man's feet, whose name was Saul."

I do not know if Saul was an active participant in the stoning of Stephen, or just a witness. In Acts 7, 59:60, Paul recounts Stephen on his knees, calling to God. Praying that the Lord Jesus would receive his spirit, and crying with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. This event, so remarkably similar to the death of our Lord and Savior, obviously had a deep impact on Saul, and the path he would later take. "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do", and they cast lots, dividing up His garments among themselves. (Luke 23, 34),

After this stoning Saul requested permission from the Pharisees to travel to Damascus to continue to imprison and beat the disciples of Jesus. On the road to Damascus, the Lord called out to Saul twice: "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?" (Acts 9:4) Our Lord has to blind Saul and have him healed by one of the very disciples being persecuted before Paul would ever be.

Then later in Acts 10, Peter, in a vision, is reminded that what God has created, let no man call unclean. In Acts 12:12, Peter is told by God to kill and eat, "Wherein were all manner of four footed beasts of the earth, and wild beasts, and creeping things, and fowls of the air." He was also told to stay with Simon a tanner. All these things were forbidden under Jewish Law. What God has created, let no man call unclean. Is there anything or anyone that was not created by God? Absolutely not!

After Paul's conversion, he traveled to Asia, Africa, and Europe spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Obeying the Laws of Moses will not get you into Heaven. Diet and circumcision are works,

and works won't save you. Putting our trust in Jesus Christ and proclaiming Him as our Savior is the only path to Salvation!

Towards the end of Paul's life, while under house arrest in Rome, Peter visits Paul, and they together preach the love of Christ and baptize new believers.

Saul and Simon both started with a deep conviction that the obedience of the Pharisees and the Laws of Moses was the only way to please the Lord, and then only if the person was a Jew. How many of our beliefs are wrong? Will it take a catastrophic event in our lives to force us to open our eyes? Salvation is available to anyone who asks and puts his trust in Jesus! It doesn't matter who you are, or what race you are.

The book of Acts is so important in that it shows the development of Christianity into the religion we know, proclaiming the universal love of God to all men who accept Him as our Savior. Saul (Paul) and Simon (Peter), in the beginning of their journey to salvation, were like most of the Jewish people, very hateful of anyone who was not a Jew. As Jesus molded these men into Peter and Paul they became the reason we know about the love of Christ. And the reason I, a Gentile, proclaim - Jesus is my Lord and Savior!
